5. Journal of Intercultural Communication

Jens Allwood gives us information about the "Journal of Intercultural Communication" which is an electronic journal with peer review available at http://www.immi.se/intercultural/

The journal is run on 100% voluntary work, in cooperation with the Immigrant institute in Borås, Sweden. The journal works well and has a very large number of readers from all around the world. Statistics on the number of readers shows for example that in October 2006 there were 34 000 hits. The statistics are available at the website http://www.immi.se/internetstatistik.htm The Journal of Intercultural Communication belongs to category A on the European ranking scale on academic journals.

Maria Isaksson raises the question whether participants at the NIC conference should publish their papers in the Journal of Intercultural Communication rather than in a conference publication.

Liisa Salo-Lee suggests a special edition of the Journal of Intercultural Communication with selected peer reviewed articles after the conference. Another suggestion is to have an edition devoted to a specific theme, 'Power' for example.

Jens Allwood concludes that it could be possible to have certain issues of the journal on special themes (like power and intercultural communication).
